# In The Heat of the Summer for Camellias

Camellias can handle the summers, but not the dryness; and not the jump from 75 degrees to 109 degrees in one day. In these circumstances, diligence is required. Camellias in containers should be checked twice a day as they dry out much faster than shrubs planted in the ground. Water the container plant deeply whenever the top 2" to 4" (5-10cm) of potting mix feels dry to the touch, then allow the pot to drain. Never allow the container to stand in water. For planted camellias, you may need to water twice in a day. Here are some other tips for the dog days of summer: water in the evening, hold off on pruning any burnt leaves as they are protecting the underlying leaves from the sun, and do not fertilize until the weather cools.

# Monthly Care Reminders For Your Camellias

#### August

Water during long dry spells. Ground should be moist, not wet! A reliable indicator is if your Azalea leaves are beginning to droop, you need to water.

# September

Begin Gibbing early in the month. DO NOT gib more than 4 or 5 bloom buds per plant at a time. Repeat every other week through November. Begin debudding, leaving 1 bud on the terminal end of a branch.

## October

Continue Gibbing. Check Air-Layers. They can usually be taken off of the mother plant by now. Put them in pots with an appropriate growing medium and leave them in pots for 1 year. Fertilize your landscape plants with 0-0-22.
