each bloom bigger. Proper camellia care in the spring produces beautiful camellia blooms for fall and winter.

Hope to see all of you at our next event, Camellia Air Layer Harvest Workshop on August 23, 2014, 9:00 AM – Noon, Hofheimer Camellia Garden, Norfolk Botanical Garden. There are over 200 air layers to remove and pot. Bring your gloves and pruners. Refreshments will be served and there will be air layers for sale. This is always a fun event and a great learning opportunity. See you there!

#### **MONTHLY CARE REMINDERS FOR YOUR CAMELLIAS**

We should be wrapped up with pruning. If you prune in June or later you will be cutting off bloom buds for the coming season. There is a saying (with a number of variations) that you never prune come June.

Now, and through the summer, water if two weeks pass without rain. Mulch plants with pine straw 2-4 inches. If you want to root cuttings, May through August is the best time to do it.

As the temperature rises, it becomes not advisable to spray your camellias with oil. Wait until it starts to cool this fall.

In July, fertilize again with 16-4-8, or use Azalea-Camellia fertilizer 4-8-12 and water it in. Check Air-Layers. If damaged and moss is dry, spray with water and re-wrap.

Bob not only air layers and pots them, he tirelessly cares for them for years, then packs them in his car and brings them to every VCS event. The club has given away hundreds of Bob's plants including such classics as Grace Albritton, Grand Slam, White Empress, and Sparkling Burgundy.

I doubt there are any VCS members that don't have one, or more of his wonderful plants in their yard. If you glance at the back of a tag and it has the distinctive RW and a date such as 4-07, you know when Bob propagated it and that it came from his large collection in his Ocean View neighborhood.

Even though Bob is stepping down from the Ambassador program he is still very active in the club and has just joined the Board for another term. Bob's energy and enthusiasm are contagious and an inspiration to other members. The club is looking for volunteers to help keep the program going. Bob air layered over a hundred plants last year so we still have a great inventory. Many thanks to Ambassador Bob for his years of service!

## **VCS SPRING WORKSHOP REPORT 2014**

The morning of April 5, 2014, began with temperatures in the sixties, but as the morning progressed and we prepared for our spring workshop in the Hofheimer Camellia Garden, the temperature rapidly plummeted to the low fifties. However, there was some sunshine and no rain. As the time to begin the workshop approached, it began to warm up a little and we ended up with a fairly comfortable day to work. Thirty-eight people were in attendance. Following introductions, Mike Andruczyk gave an erudite discussion of diseases that affect camellias. This generated many questions from the audience validating the need for such a presentation. Next, Doug Simon gave a demonstration of proper pruning of normal sized camellias to improve their health and control their size and shape, while Mike Andruczyk demonstrated the pruning of overgrown camellias. We then divided into two groups, those experienced in air-layering and those inexperienced. They then went out in pairs and put on 211 air-layers that will be removed and potted up at our August 23, 2014 workshop and subsequently sold to raise funds for the support of the Hofheimer Garden. We sold 2 VCS memberships and 1 ACS membership. Our horticulturist Matthew Gobla brought a nice collection of air-layers from last year's workshop and 11 of these were sold for \$15.00 each, providing funds for the Hofheimer Garden. This was once again a highly successful workshop that provided education to the public and support to the Norfolk Botanical Garden, the VCS and the ACS. Many thanks to all who attended and helped to make this possible. We were especially glad to see Jim and Sally Van Gorder who came all the way from Jacksonville, NC and brought their grandson Seth Van Gorder and his wife Ashleigh who live in the area.
